# HOW EMPLOYERS FIND THE RIGHT APPRENTICES

## WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP\*?

- On the job training combined with study (usually one day a week)
- Minimum wage £3.30 an hour for apprentices aged 16-18 including 19 & over in first year
- National Minimum Wage after first year
- Apprenticeships take between 1 and 4 years to complete depending on level

# FINDING APPRENTICES IS EASIER THAN YOU THINK

You'll be surprised how quick and easy the whole process really is, and there are several ways to start. Remember, for an apprenticeship to qualify as such, it must last for a minimum of one year. If you cannot commit to this, you should go through an apprenticeship training agency.

## THE NATIONAL APPRENTICESHIP SERVICE

The National Apprenticeship Service (NAS) supports employers, advises them on their requirements and helps explain how the recruitment process works. This includes:

- **Free recruitment support and ongoing guidance**
- **Eligibility checks for grants and/or funding**
- **A register of training organisations/colleges offering appropriate apprenticeships**

## APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING AGENCIES

Apprenticeship training agencies recruit, employ and arrange training for apprentices on behalf of employers. This means you:

- **Won't be the apprentice's employer**
- **Can stop employing the apprentice more easily if you need to**
- **Pay a fee to the agency for the apprentice to work for you**

You may have identified someone who already works for you. Alternatively, you can advertise an apprenticeship vacancy just like any other job opportunity. And there are a number of useful avenues open to you:

- **LOCAL training providers**
